- The World Defense Tactics Association (WDTA) and International Defense Tactics College (IDTC): IMAF-Europe and the WDTA have now mutual cooperation agreement. By establishing the Protection and Security Division for IMAF-Europe and national platforms for the Security and Defense Tactics Division all members of IMAF-Europe can now benefit of the educational offers by these partners.
- The Nihon Kobudo Bu Jutsu Department for education and training in the field of Traditional Budo.



IMAF EUROPE EUROPEAN OPEN CHAMPIONSHIPS 2014

After a long and careful planning period the EOC 2014 commenced on 18th October 2014 in the small and beautiful town of Nowe in Poland.

For IMAF Europe the preparation started the year before, in Alba Iulia, Romania when representatives of IMAF Poland and the town of Nowe presented the their plans about the organisation. Centre of the presentation was an information stand with information folders and booklets about the location and Nowe. It is evident, that this was the result of a long and careful planning process.

The opening of the EOC 2014 was spectacular with a parade of all officials, athletes and flags of the participating countries, entering the sport hall. After the opening ceremony, with a ladies vocal group, with speeches from the President of IMAF Poland and IMAF Europe, the Mayor of Nowe and several other officials, the first competitions began.


On three Tatami several categories commenced, from Karate-Do Kata to Sport Jujutsu, and Kobudo.
